As the summer is flying by, we wanted to share with you a few amazing 2025 museum moments...

Foothiller Rosie the Riveters?

During WWII, our maternal grandparents lived in San Diego. While both of them were raised on farms in Nebraska, during the Great Depression, they lost their farm and relocated west.

During the war, our grandmother Edna Day Ellison worked for the Army Air Force first as a General Mechanics Helper then as an Aircraft Worker, first in Sacramento and later in San Diego. She worked in assembly and repair and engine overhaul. Yes, she was definitely a "Rosie the Riveter". We found this information from our grandparents' income tax records, which yes, we have.

We realize that there must be many Foothiller women who worked in airplane or other war effort factories in San Diego or elsewhere. If you know of a Foothiller who was a "Rosie", please share the information with us.

We have purchased a replica Congressional Gold Medal, which in 2024 honored these women more than 80 years after their contributions. Now we are honoring them in our War Memorial showcase.

WASP Mural

Both women received the Congressional Gold Medal in 2009. Their mural will be on the wall adjacent to the Astronaut mural, facing the east side of the pool and visible from the museum as well. \$9000

Eddie De Coito Old Gym Floor Plaque. **During the summer of 2024, the original** 1937 Old Gym floor was replaced and with it a painted remembrance of the court being named the "Edward DeCoito Court". We'd like to honor Eddie, a longtime classified employee and volunteer, with a small bronze plaque on one of the walls: \$500

Frank Zappa Research

In January we received an email from Steve Apple, who after visiting our website, wanted to visit in person: "I'm primarily interested in orchestra and/or band related photos, musical recordings and documentation from the Fall of 1954 through the summer of 1955."

During his first Saturday visit, we realized he was interested in researching Frank Zappa, who attended GHS his freshman year. During his Saturday visits, Steve found documentation of Zappa's freshman year at GHS that we had not known. The most dramatic one is a 1955 yearbook photo of Frank at the drums in the Blue and Gold Band on the stage of the 1937 Old Gym.



Before Steve's second Saturday visit, he emailed us, "Thank you very much for all the help last month in your wonderful museum as I researched Frank Zappa - much appreciated! I'd love to visit you again this Saturday to see the 1950s era music records you mentioned you have/had in storage."

More treasures awaited as he found a March 30, 1955 program "The Concert Band and the Red Robe Choir in Combined Concert" in the vocal music showcase. Under "Band Personnel", Frank Zappa is listed as one of the 5 "Percussion" members.



Many, many dozens, if not hundreds, of serious Frank Zappa fans concentrated primarily throughout Europe and North America have now seen photos of Mr. Zappa in the Grossmont 1955 yearbook as well as his name in the March 1955 concert program I encountered in your fine museum that I subsequently photographically shared on the internet this year - all thanks to you!"

GHS Museum Student Visitors

This year, 2400 GHS Foothillers visited the museum in their English classes. Many of them returned again and again during lunch on Fridays to see more of our amazing history. There are too many moments to share, but we will share two.

When visiting with his English class, Freshman Kayden Padilla shared with us that his great-great grandfather had a trophy in the museum; well, after some searching, we discovered that Bert Kohnhorst, 1951-52 Track Runner, was honored on the amazing 1950s Perpetual Athletic Trophy, which celebrates one athlete from each year from 1951 to 1959 in each boys sport: Tennis, Cross Country, Basketball, Football, Track, Wrestling.

Later looking at the 1921-1983 Track Records assembled by alumnus Mel Gapen, in 1983, Bert held the 220 yard track record of 21.5 recorded at the CIF Southern Section in May 1952. The fastest GHS time ever in the 100 yard was run by Gary Guglielmetti with a time of 9.8 in 1964. Bert had two meets with times of 9.9 both in March and April of 1952, one at Hoover, one at GHS.

This year, the students' excitement and enjoyment of the museum and its displays was evident every Friday. At the end of May, on the last day we were open to student visitors, several stopped by to say goodbye and to have us sign their yearbooks...remember that?
